Will work with Jennifer Thornton on SKIES data. Tina reported no weatherization funding through SBCTC.</li> <li>○ <i>Section #3</i> – Commerce will lead. Molly will work with the State Energy Office and International Trade &amp; Economic Development Division (ITED) to obtain this info.</li> <li>○ <i>Section #4</i> – Commerce will lead. Helping applicants and customers connect to resources.</li> <li>• We need a sub-committee between industry and the college system, particularly with utilities/energy efficiency.
