

Questions and Answers for 10% OJT Application

Is there a possibility of extending the due date deadline?

Yes, the application due date has been extended to January 6, 2011.

Do the participants for this OJT have to be WIA Eligible?

Yes all participants enrolled must meet WIA Eligibility for Dislocated Worker, Adult or Older Youth.

Are there Administration Dollars for this grant?

No, administration costs are not an allowable cost under the Governors 10% funds.

For the (E) Priority of Service section, do you want a re-statement of the population that we will describe in section (B), or....?

Following the Priority of Service Policy, please describe how you will provide priority of service for the target population.

The (F) Data Entry and Performance section doesn't have any questions. Are we supposed to respond to this section and if so, what is the expectation?

No response is required in this section. We will be providing data entry instructions at a later date.

In the final paragraph that describes the application assessment criteria, can you elaborate on what you mean by "high potential for job creation?"

Consistent with the Governor's letter outlining the use of these funds, the focus of your application should be on job creation with an emphasis on on-the-job training.

In that same last paragraph, the statement about budgets maximizing outcomes per dollar invested means you want cheap OJTs or how will you evaluate the value?

This is an opportunity to meet the Governors request for job creation by demonstrating a net increase in jobs that involve training within your local area. Applications with high training costs in family wage jobs will not be at a disadvantage due to cost of training.
