OLYMPIA—The Workforce Training & Education Coordinating Board has released a poster that features an overview of many of **the state's** workforce development services used to train Washington residents for jobs across the state.

This poster provides an at-a-glance summary of most of **Washington's largest** workforce development programs. These programs provide services to many populations of Washington residents from high schoolers immersed in career-connected learning to adults training for new careers that lead to living-wage jobs.

This poster is an easy-to-read display of **Washington's workforce development** services, and is used by workforce professionals, educators, counselors, and others.
