OLYMPIA—The Workforce Training & Education Coordinating Board has released a poster that gives an overview of the state's workforce development services, which are used to train nearly 1 million Washington residents for jobs across the state.

This poster provides an at-a-glance summary of Washington's largest workforce development programs: from adults training for new careers that lead to living-wage jobs to youth learning skills to prepare them for future careers.
