OLYMPIA—The Workforce Training & Education Coordinating Board recently released a poster featuring the state's workforce development services, which are used by nearly 1 million people statewide to prepare a skilled workforce for Washington.

This poster provides an at-a-glance summary of the state's workforce system: from youth learning work-ready skills to unemployed adults receiving career training that leads to living-wage jobs. It shows key results including how much program participants earned and their employment rate.

The poster provides an easy-to-read display of Washington's workforce development services and helps shed light on training options for job-seekers and students.
