Key themes in the draft plans include: Forging better connections between business and the workforce system, bringing together a variety of workforce programs to better serve customers, using technology to increase access to services, and putting in place a next-generation accountability system to evaluate workforce program performance.

The forum is a joint effort of the state's Workforce Training and Education Coordinating Board and the Workforce Development Council of Seattle - King County.
