VANCOUVER—The public is invited to provide feedback and help shape the state's workforce development plans by participating in a forum from 9-11 a.m., Friday, Sept. 11, at Educational Service District 112, 2500 N.E. 65th Ave.

Key themes in the draft plans include: Forging better connections between business and the workforce system, bringing together a variety of workforce programs to better serve customers, using technology to increase access to services, and putting in place a next-generation accountability system to evaluate workforce program performance.

The forum is a joint effort of the state's Workforce Training and Education Coordinating Board and the Southwest Washington Workforce Development Council.
